Students are advised to pursue minor course work early in their studies to ensure enough time to meet course requirements. Not all courses listed below are offered on a regular basis. Students must declare the minor through IAS before or at the time the graduation application is completed. Students must complete the following requirements for a minor in Human Rights:

**Note: The equivalent of 3 credits of practical experience in a human rights-related area is required for the human rights minor within the 25 credits. The Practical Experience Requirement form must be approved and completed with Prof. Bruce Kochis prior to starting the project/work. Once the work is completed, the form must be returned to the IAS program office. Students taking BIS 403 Washington D.C. Seminar on Human Rights have automatically satisfied this requirement. Other work must be approved/supervised by faculty offering courses appropriate to the minor.
